Greeting

You are hereby commanded to attach, seize, take  
and safely keep, the goods, chattels, lands, tenements, and credits, of  
Walter Hall wherever in your bailiwick the same may be found, to  
the value of as well the sum of two hundred Dollars, as the sum  
one hundred Dollars, for the costs & charges, which may or shall accrue  
in the premises, & when you have the same so attached or any  
part thereof the same in your custody safely keep, so that  
you have the same before the Judges of our court of common  
pleas to be holden in the town of Arkansas, on the first Monday  
of December next, then there to be condemned according to  
an act of the Legislature of this Territory, entitled an act  
directing the method of proceeding against absent and absconding  
debtors, to & for the use of Jacob Durost, unless the said  
Walter Hall by himself or agent shall appear & answer to the  
said Jacob Durost or his attorney in a plea of trespass on the  
case to the damage of the said <sup>Jacob</sup> Durost the sum of three hundred  
Dollars, you likewise are commanded to make known to  
any person or persons in whose hands such property may be  
found if to them <sup>or either of them</sup> it seem meet to be and appear on the  
day & place aforesaid, before the Judges aforesaid, to shew  
cause why such goods, chattels, lands, tenements & credits, so  
attached aforesaid shall not be condemned and execution  
had and made as in other cases, of recoveries & Judgements,  
given in courts of records, and that you make known unto  
the said court how you shall have executed this writ  
and have you then this writ, given under my hand at my  
chamber the twenty third day of August one thousand eight  
hundred & ten, & of the independance of the united States the thirty  
fifth - -
